Alphabet Hide and Seek



Instructions

- 1. Cut apart the alphabet flash cards and hide them around the room. Choose lowercase or uppercase letters. Use painter's tape to attach the letters on cupboard doors, windows, drawers, toys, and shelves. The choices are endless! If possible, try to place the letters at your child's height so they would see them more easily.
- 2. Give your child a corresponding tracing sheet (lowercase and uppercase) and something to write with.
- 3. Have your child search for the alphabet cards. Each time they find one, ask them to trace the matching letter on their tracing sheet.

Extend it:

- Mix the uppercase and lowercase letters and give BOTH tracing sheets.
- Letter of the week: Stick it up on the fridge or on the wall near where the kids play. Somewhere they are likely to see it regularly. Do activities centered around the letter of the week.
- Flash Cards: These letters can also be cards. Hold them up to your child and they recall what the letter is. Use the picture to help them learn the letter name and letter sound. A is for apple.

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
